How to Plant Casaba Melon Seeds

From Annie Bidwell's Diary for 1907

How to plant Casaba seeds -

Plow ground twice and cultivate it until very fine. Furrow it out in rows eight feet apart. Then plant seeds in hills eight feet apart. Before planting dig holes and fill them with manure, one bushel to each hole and put ten inches of earth on top of manure. Plant seeds under one half inch of the earth. Put about ten seeds in each place.




Pioneer Day Parade

The other areas of the Visitor Center including the General's Store and the theater will remain open.


THE GENERAL'S STORE
